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COVID-19 School Notification, Positive Case in School

December 13, 2021

Dear School Community Members:

The purpose of today's general communication is to keep you informed of the district's incidences related to COVID-19, as well as important information regarding collaboration with and notification to the school. Please take the time to fully read this notice.

Several individuals at Midland School have been identified as positive for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). One case was identified from December 10, 2021 and two other cases were identified on December 11, 2021 and reported to the school today, December 13, 2021. All persons considered possible close/primary contacts and falling into the category of having to specifically quarantine because of close contact are receiving private individual communications from the school nurse, administration, and / or teacher(s).

The district will be establishing a "COVID-19 Tracker" that will be shared with you in the near future. Rather than sending general announcements by way of this type of letter, the COVID-19 Tracker will be available for reference at all times on the district website. Whenever there is an addition to the Tracker an alert notice will be sent to you via the district's notification system. Please visit your Realtime portal to ensure your family contact information, including email and cell phone number(s) are all up to date and accurate.

The district continues to coordinate closely with public health officials and to follow CDC, state, and local health department guidance in order to assure the health and safety of our community. Practices for contact tracing, and requirements for quarantining for those who test positive and for those who are identified as possible primary contacts will continue to be implemented in accordance with the New Jersey Department of Health guidelines.

As in prior communications, we encourage all members of our community to continue following the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention and New Jersey Department of Health promoted safeguards. The importance of continuing to monitor for symptoms, remaining home and not exposing oneself to others when not feeling well continues to be of importance. While this has been on-going, there is a heightened need for this as there is an increase in incidences of positive cases following the Thanksgiving break. COVID-19 Activity Level Index (CALI) Report published by the New Jersey Department of Health Communicable Disease Service continues to be published weekly and is available at https://www.nj.gov/health/cd/statistics/covid/. As of the week ending December 4, 2021 the state's CALI report has returned the entire state "Orange" - indicating a "High Level" of transmission across New Jersey. Unfortunately, this school community is also experiencing an increase in positive cases.

Please take all necessary precautions to practice the recommended health and safety guidelines. It is also imperative that you keep your child at home if he/she is unwell. Always consult with the school nurse, Mrs. Meyers, so she may give you the necessary guidance and discuss with you the appropriate time for your child to return to school. Furthermore, if your child or a member of your household receives a positive COVID-19 test result after school hours it is critical that you email a notice to Mrs. Meyers, School Nurse, at smeyers@arechellepark.org, and Mr. Alberta, School Principal, at <a href="mailto:mailto

As there are changes in COVID-19 levels and guidelines from the State and CDC, we will adjust our practices accordingly so we may continue to provide a safe and healthy community to all of our members.
